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This week we have asked the different key stages to look at what the pupils will be learning this half term.

#### KS1

#### Mardle, Bovey & Tavy.

This half term KS1 are exploring the topic, 'Once Upon a Time'. We are reading the story of *Little Red* and learning lots of new literacy skills such as speech marks and expanded noun phrases. In history, we are studying how the High Street has changed over the last 80 years and are focussing particularly on Newton Abbot and are hoping to also arrange to a visit into town. Maths has been fun and varied. Following a unit on money, we are now starting division and multiplication to really get our brains working. We are also all getting excited about World Book Day next week, get those costumes prepared.

#### Tamar, Teign & Torridge.

Year 5 & 6 are focusing on our use of vocabulary this term. We carefully selected some of the tier 2 statutory words together which we felt would be useful within our literacy topic: **Women in Science**. We have these words displayed in the classroom and frequently revisit them to develop our understanding and embed this vocabulary.




Our year 5 & 6 children are beginning to write about their own inspirational person using the biography genre. In maths, we are developing our knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages. Special shout out for our fabulous and resilient year 6s who are very busy preparing for their SATs which will take place in the Summer term.

#### Plym, Dart & Exe.

The children will be continuing to learn how to play the recorder and building on their reading of pitch and rhythm notation from last term. We will also be learning about 20th century minimalism in music. The children will listen to and discuss different examples of music from the genre and then create their own minimalist style pieces.

We will be reading *Heard it in the Playground* by Allan Ahlberg and writing our own poetry. During Maths, we will be working on fractions of shapes and numbers and exploring the terms, denominator and numerator. In History, we are looking at **The Kingdom of Benin** and in RE we are finding out about Hinduism and Hindus in Britain today. In science we will be undertaking lots if practical work to explore our topic on **sound**.

### **BRITISH VALUES DAY**



Last Monday, we had our British Values Day. We were lucky enough to have our valued school governor, Phil Bullivant, join us for our assembly where we talked about the British Values and he shared a bit about his job as a councillor for Newton Abbot. Each year group explored a different British Value:

#### Early years: Respect and Tolerance KS1: The Rule of Law Year 3&4: Democracy Year 5&6: Individual Liberty.

We enjoyed learning about the individual British Value and considered what each of these meant for us. We took part in debates, discussion, research and more.

The year 5&6 children had the opportunity to ask Mr Bullivant questions. Some of these included asking about how schools are funded and the issues with the roads in Newton Abbot. Our oldest pupils were so inspired by the day that they have decided to revamp the school council, and children will be able to elect two members of their class to represent them. We are collating some of our work to share altogether in assembly on Friday and we will be creating a new British Values display!


Taw class had 98.5% attendance for the period of 5th - 9th February 2024.




### We will be taking part in World Book Day on Thursday 7th March.
