Head Teacher


- · Monitors all the attendance.

Under 93% attendance

 You may be asked for medical evidence for future absences.

Lateness

- If your child is consistently late, you will receive a late letter.
- If there is no improvement, you will be asked to meet with the Headteacher.

Under 90%

- You will receive an Amber Letter.
- The Headteacher will meet with you to discuss your child's absence and how the school can help. This may involve Early Help.

Ongoing concern

- You will receive a Red Letter.
- There will be a further meeting with the Headteacher...
- There will be a discussion with the Attendance Improvement Officer to consider next steps.


A space for how to stay mentally and physically healthy

Problem solving is finding a path to reach a goal when the path is uncertain. Whenever we accomplish something without knowing how beforehand, we are solving a problem.

- . Identify the problem. Just stating the problem out loud can make a big difference for kids who are feeling stuck.
- Develop at least five possible solutions. Brainstorm possible ways to solve the problem. ...
- . Identify the pros and cons of each solution. ...
- . Pick a solution. ...
- . Test it out


ACHIEVEMENTS
