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#### A MESSAGE FROM MS REDWOOD

Dear parents/carers,

Welcome back- I hope you all had a fantastic summer and are enjoying the lovely weather this week. I hope your children have enjoyed their first week back at school and have been telling you all about their new teachers and exciting learning.

#### What are we learning?

Our foundation stage children will be exploring and investigating around the topic of, ROAR!!!

In KS1, the topic will be "London's Calling!". The children will be exploring life in a city and looking at what physical and human features make different cities around the world. They hope to visit Exeter Cathedral later in the term. Literacy will be based around the 'Naughty Bus' story and the children will create their own adventure story for their bus.

In years 3 and 4, the children will be exploring the local area and looking at the differences between urban and rural areas through the topic of, "Urban Pioneers". As part of their rural study, they are hoping to arrange a visit to Dartmoor.

Year 5 and 6 are learning all about "The Terrible Tudors" and what the Tudors did for us. As part of this topic, in literacy, they are already diving into Shakespeare by studying, "Macbeth.

#### **School Uniform**

As from next week, with the weather becoming cooler, we will expect children to wear normal school uniform.

#### Uniform requirements are as follows:

- Purple jumper / sweatshirt / cardigan with or without school logo (we have a limited amount of stock available on Schoolcomms with the school logo)
- Grey trousers / shorts / pinafore / 'A' line skirt
- White polo shirt / white shirt / white blouse
- Purple gingham dress
- P.E. Kit Purple T-shirt, black shorts and PE Bag.
- Winter and sun hats and book bags.

We put a high priority on children getting plenty of exercise so are happy with children wearing PLAIN black trainers instead of shoes (no logos please). Children need a change of clothing for PE and Games. PE kit can be kept in school in a named bag hung on their peg.

All pupils should have a suitable waterproof outdoor coat for playtimes and outdoor learning.

When ordering uniform you will have the option to have your uniform:

- Delivered to school (this is once a month and not in school holidays)
- Selected address Royal Mail £4.50
- Selected address DPD £7.80

Returns – The school will not be dealing with returns, these are dealt directly with the uniform supplier.

We take pride in the way we present ourselves at Highweek Community Primary School, and all pupils are expected to comply with our uniform requirements. Please let us know if you have any difficulties providing appropriate uniform as we are more than willing to help out. We have a huge amount of lost property and donated items available.

Please note that there are a number of children wearing tight short skirts. These restrict physical activity and are not appropriate for school. Any child continuing to wear inappropriate uniform from next week will bring home a slip from the school and be expected to return the following day in the correct uniform.

#### **Building work and updates**

As you can see we have scaffolding around parts of our school at the moment so I would like to update you on what has been happening at our school.

Painting - We are currently having the exterior of our school painted to give it a fresh and inviting look upon arrival for our pupils. We are hoping for this to be completed very shortly.

Windows - Our school is very fortunate to have new windows installed throughout the school which will help keeping our school warm within the winter months and help with energy efficiency. This work will continue for another two weeks and then will be completed over the October half term.

EYFS - We have had building works over the summer to increase our building capacity ready for the arrivals of our new 2 year olds into Nursery. This is very exciting and the space is looking fantastic.

Sensory Room - We now have two sensory rooms at opposite ends of the school.

A big thank you to our caretaker, Mr Chris Rogers for his hard work over the holidays with all of the above.

As always, if you have any concerns or you would like to come and talk to me about any school issues, please do not hesitate to see me on the gate in the mornings or arrange an appointment through the school office.


