Nursery Preview Learning (Tiny Taws -Children aged 2)

The children in Tiny Taws have really enjoyed Nursery Rhyme week. We are now busy creating a booklet of all of the children's favourites shared throughout the week, so look out for that coming soon.

Next week we will be exploring the story of Goldilocks and the three bears. We will focus on size and how Baby Bear was feeling linking to our zones of regulation.

Nursery Preview Learning (Mini Moles– Children aged 3 and 4)

We have been learning all things shapes this week. We have used 2D shapes to create rockets and planets. We discussed their names and their key features. Next week, we will be exploring positional language. Why not try using some at home: Next to, on top, in between, behind, in front and underneath.

Our story next week is **QPootles5**. It's all about an alien who is off to a moon Party. Why not talk to your child about his adventures?



Things are going to start getting festive next week too. As we get closer to our nativity performance we will introduce the children to lots of exciting Christmas activities.

Reception Preview Learning

The children are working hard to apply the skills they have been learning in phonics to write simple CVC words. These are words built of a consonant, vowel, consonant such as cat, hat or log. We are really focusing on letter formation. Please challenge your child to write some of these simple words at home.

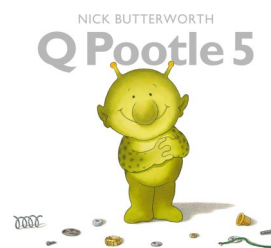


You will have now had a go at reading some of these CVC words in the purple blending books. In the reading folders you will also have found a reading books to enjoy together. This is to help develop your child's love of reading.

Don't forget to bring your child's reading folders/bookbags every Thursday so these can be changed.

Next week we are learning the story, **QPootles5**

This is all about an alien on his way to a moon party. Why not see if you can spot the moon, talk about what it looks like and what you would do at a moon party?



In maths this week we have focused on 2D shapes such as: circles, squares and triangles. Next week we will be exploring 3D shapes: such as cubes, cylinders and pyramids. We will use these to build a giant rocket for us all to head out to space together for a moon party adventure.
