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A MESSAGE FROM MS REDWOOD

Dear Parents/Carers.

Christmas

All the staff will tell you that this half term is everyone's favourite. As we lead up to Christmas, school is a very busy place as we celebrate through nativities, carol concerts, making gifts etc as well as continuing with our usual learning. We hope that you will be able to attend one of the many Christmas celebrations next week.

Changes to the school day and the excitement or sometimes worry about the Christmas holidays, can cause some children to become anxious, resulting in some challenging behaviours at home or at school. We aim to ensure that all children are aware of any timetable changes and prepare them as best we can for Christmas events.

Last Friday evening, Highweek singing group had the opportunity to perform at Exeter Cathedral. They joined a number of other choirs to perform collectively as well as having their own performance slot. It was a fantastic opportunity for all involved. I would like to say a big thank you to Mrs Kerry Slade for organising this event and to all the parents who joined us.

An inclusive school

At Highweek, we pride ourselves on being an inclusive school. What does this mean? It means that we aim to eliminate all forms of discrimination. We believe that all children have a right to a high quality education regardless of gender, abilities or characteristics. However, this does not mean that all behaviours are tolerated.

The following behaviours are not accepted at Highweek:

- Bullying
- Non age-appropriate physical violence against staff or other pupils
- Swearing
- Behaviour that results in damage to property
- Continual disruptive behaviour.

The vast majority of pupils at Highweek display excellent standards of behaviour. However, if any of the above behaviours are exhibited, any of the following could occur:

- Restorative conversations with all parties
- A child having to work separately to their classmates for a set period of time
- A child not being able to go out with their friends at break or lunch time for a set period of time
- Suspension from school for a set period of time (usually up to five days)
- Permanent exclusion from school.

School Funding

Many schools, particularly in Devon are finding it increasingly difficult to afford the staffing levels and resources they would like in order to continue to provide the standard of education that our children deserve. You may be interested to know that the government funds schools differently depending on county and area. Devon receives far less funding than the majority of England. For example, schools in Tower Hamlets receive over £8000 per child compared to £5713 per pupil in Devon. I wanted to let you know that I recently wrote to Devon County Council, the current Education secretary and the shadow cabinet outlining my concerns around this issue. As a result of this, we are looking forward to welcoming a member of the Department of Education into school next week to discuss this further.

Unfortunately, we continue to see the negative aspects of being online filter into school. There are numerous resources available to help you and your child(ren) navigate the world of social media. How to start a conversation with your child about using a phone safely:

Why do you want to get a phone?

Whilst deciding if it is time for your child to have their first phone can be a great opportunity to find out what your child expects to use their phone for. This could be for connecting with friends, playing games, for keeping in touch whilst out of the house or other reasons.

▲ What do you like about using your phone?

You can ask your child about their favourite apps or games, what they like using their phone for, or you can ask them to show you how to play or use their favourite game or website.

What would you do if something worrying or upsetting happened on your phone?

You can ask them about the places they can go to find the safety advice, find out what they know about privacy settings, and ask them how to report or block on the services they use.

How can we do more online together?

Ask your child about activities or games that you could enjoy as a family, this can be a great time to establish a <u>family agreement</u> to manage your families time online.

Top tips



Talk with your child about responsible use of their phone

Discuss what is okay and not okay to use their phone for. Talk about time limits and expectations of where the device can and cannot be used, this could include things like the phone being charged outside their bedroom overnight.



Discuss what to do if something upsetting or worrying happens

Give them the strategies they need in case something concerning happens whilst they are using their device. This could be to lock the screen and tell an adult, to make a report to the platform they are using, or to block the user.



Explore parental controls

Take a look at the controls available both on the phone itself and on your home Wi-Fi. Talk these through with your child too. Parental controls are a helpful tool, but an open conversation with your child is the most important thing.


