#### **Nursery Preview Learning**

What a lovely sunny week, the children have been busy outside exploring different ways of moving and travelling. This is linked to our focus story The Ginger bread Man.

We have been moving fast and slow, as well as hopping, jumping and skipping as fast as we can.

We have been talking lots about travelling and different places we have visited. Maybe talk with your child about how you travel,

walking, driving or cycling?

Next week we will be following maps and roads to work on our pencil skills, we will follow tracks in circles and lines before having a go at letter shapes too.

We are also exploring numbers one to five

1, 2, 3, 4, 5

We will be singing counting songs, writing numbers and matching different amounts to the correct numerals too.

### **Reception Preview Learning**

Thanks to all of this beautiful sunshine we have been able to get outside and explore. We have been on a nature hunt and completed lots of speedy races experimenting with different ways of travelling.

Next week we will begin our progress writes. These happen once ever term to see how children's writing has improved. The children will be writing simple sentences, ensuring they include capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. The children will work hard to apply their phonics skills. Why not have a go at one at home together.

In **Maths** we are consolidating our knowledge of numbers one to 10 to really deepen our understanding of number.
